## Work Safely With Lead

Ensure levels of lead in the blood are kept to a minimum by following the safety guidelines.

#### **Hands**

- Apply barrier cream before starting work.
- Wear gloves when handling lead.
- Keep hands away from your face.
- Don't bite your fingernails and keep them short.
- After finishing work, scrub hands thoroughly using industrial hand cleaner or heavy duty lead wipes.







Lead can only be absorbed by:

# Inhalation: Breathing in Dust or Fumes

### Ingestion:

By Eating or Passing Hand to Mouth



- Use disposable tissues rather than handkerchiefs.
- Never eat, drink or smoke when working with lead.
- When welding or stripping lead, wear an appropriate, clean mask.





### **Arms/Body**

- Wear the correct PPE.
- Remove work wear before leaving site.
- Always wash work wear separately, ideally on site.
- If frequently working with lead, ensure blood lead levels are tested regularly.
- Large rolls (weighing more than 25kg) should be handled with assistance or appropriate lifting equipment.
